Principal's Report - Dr. Fagin

Respect for All Week highlights the school's commitment to inclusivity and anti-bias work.

The school is recognized as a Respect for All school by the Department of Education, and this commitment is integrated into the curriculum.

Black History Month activities include a school-wide read-aloud of the book, "The Year We Learned to Fly" and other texts focused on Black History. This text is uplifting, joyous and really pays tribute to grandparents and our ancestors. The author, Jacqueline Woodson, who visited us last year and has a relationship with our school community so it was a great fit.

Course Lotteries

The winter trimester ends on March 21st.

The spring course lottery will open on February 12, close on February 26, with results announced on March 11.

There will be a no-fee drop period that allows families to remove their child from a course without penalty for one week after the course results are released.

The device policy, which prohibits devices outside of backpacks during Kids Club and courses, with exceptions for emergencies is in effect.

Enrollment is up across all programs, including Kids Club and courses, with an average of 330 kids served daily.

Approximately 76% of kids in the school are enrolled in some type of after-school programming, with different kids attending each day.

Auditions for the upcoming fifth grade play auditions for "The Wizard of Oz," are scheduled for February 12 and 14.

Treasurer Report - Rachel M

Fundraising has reached 101% of the goal, with merchandise sales and photo day contributing significantly.

Community events and activities have seen a substantial increase, with the Book Fair bringing in unexpected revenue.

After-school programs have brought in 61% of the budget, in line with last year's performance.

A successful shopping event with Alexis Bittar raised \$1,235

Notable expenses include yoga programs for pre-K and K, school-wide life checks, and a Lunar New Year lion dance.
