PS29 lice policy reminder:

- 1 child found with lice (school checks or self reported) >> entire class notified
- 3 or more cases of lice/nits per class >> lice outbreak protocol is implemented
 - Separation/isolation of outerwear
 - Periodic lice checks by the nurse and trained staff
 - Deep cleaning by PS29 custodial staff

Our hope is that by immersing our 700+ students in the same text on the same day will help to engage our students more deeply and build community!



Comfort Dog Initiative

- His name is **Wave** and he is a 7 y.o. rescue
- Wave belongs to a former PS29 parent, Lauren McFarland. Lauren and Wave are a certified comfort dog team, which means that Lauren was trained to be Wave's "handler," and they regularly visit health care facilities, schools, and other settings to provide love, comfort, and support.
- Wave will visit the school at least twice per month for **one-hour blocks**
- Students may have the opportunity to "get to know" Wave, see him do tricks and interact with him for more individualized social-emotional learning opportu



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Student Group for Divorced Families

Our hope is to create a space every month or every other month for students to come together and know that they are not alone. They will be able to make connections with one another with the facilitation of a trained professional. This is <u>not a therapy group</u> but rather an opportunity for conversations.

- A group of students will meet every month or every other month facilitated by our social worker, Loreta.
- There will be a read-aloud for students (grouped by age depending on how many students participate) that will anchor the conversation.
- K-3 students' conversations will be connected to the read aloud, while 4th and 5th graders may also have more open conversations.

Device Policy at PS29+



PS29+ Afterschool Program Enrollment

- Enrollment at PS29+ continues to grow! Average number of kids in courses and Kid's Club grew from 305 last winter to 340 this winter, an increase of just over 10%!
- Of 715 students at PS29, 543 students (76%) use are enrolled in courses or Kid's Club plus many use the Emergency Kid's Club.


